TITLE

INTRODUCTION

Extended abstracts should be written in a form that is shorter than the full text. Subtitles of the extended abstract should be composed of the sections of **introduction, method, findings and conclusion.** The extended abstract of the full paper shall be written in Times New Roman font, single line spacing and 11 font size. Extended abstracts can contain figures and tables.

Extended abstracts should be in a structure that explains the declaration's content and, therefore, the work's preparation phase. Page margins are formed regarding the A4 page size and are 2.5 cm wide from the right, left, top and bottom. The end of the lines should be aligned to the right and there should be no syllable segmentation. **Extended abstracts should not exceed 2 pages including the references** and pages should not be numbered.

Current literature regarding the work subject should be examined and the differences of the said work from the past, and similar works should be presented clearly in the introduction section.


METHOD

FINDINGS

The main findings should be presented in this section. If you have images or tables which were results from your research, they should be displayed in this section.

All the tables and images should be centred and numbered (e.g. Figure 1). Definitions should be placed above the figure or table.






Table 1. Table Header

Resources that have been presented in the text should be listed in alphabetical order. References (e.g., Harvard, APA, MLA etc) are acceptable but should be followed consistently both in the text and at the end of the text.
